Amrita Sher-Gil (1913 – 1941)


- Amrita Sher-Gil was born on 30 January 1913
- Sher-Gil's early paintings display a significant influence of the Western modes of painting, more specifically, the post-impressionism style.
- ▶ Later career, influence of Indian art.





Ustad Allah Baksh (1895-1978)


- he was born in small town of Wairabad.
- ► He is best known today for his depictions of rural life in the country and for sujects from Hindu and persian mythology.






Abdur Rahman (1894 – 1975)


- Chughtai was born on 21 Sep 1894 in Lahore.
- Chughtai was a painter artist who created his own unique, distinctive painting style influenced by Mughal art, miniature painting and Islamic art traditions.

- ▶ Born in 1889 in Patiala state, East Punjab.
- Ustad Haji Mohammad Sharif is a known master of miniature painting.
- he inherited this art form from his forefathers who were also established miniaturists of their own times.









Anna Molka Ahmed (1917 –1994)


- Anna Molka Ahmed was born in London, England.
- She converted to Islam at the age of 18 in 1935, before marrying Sheikh Ahmed in October 1939.
- ▶ Ahmed moved to Lahore in 1940.
- Anna Molka Ahmed set up the Department of Fine Arts now called the College of Arts and Design at the University of the Punjab.






Shakir Ali (1916–1975)

- He was born in British India in 1916
- ► He first joined Mayo School of Art as a lecturer in Art in 1954.
- After changing the name of Mayo School to National College of Arts in 1958, he became its first Pakistani principal in 1962.





Saeed Akhtar 1938

- Saeed Akhtar was born in Ghakhar, Pndia in 1938.
- Saeed Akhtar graduated from National College of Arts, Lahore where he studied art from the famous Pakistani artist Shakir Ali.





Syed Sadequain Ahmed Naqvi (1923-1987)

- Sadequain was awarded Tamgha-e-Imtiaz, Pride of Performance, Sitara-e-Imtiaz, Australian Cultural Award, and Gold Mercury Award.
- He painted various series of paintings, each series rich with distinct creative idioms.
