


2.1 Modals and auxiliaries

(1) Susan's father might be visiting the campus on Thursday.




(2) John would have been camping in the forest but a mudslide blocked access to Big Sur.


Draw trees for the grammatically acceptable sentences. Explain, using subcategorization frames, the contrast between these and the unacceptable sentences.
