



## **Five types of Social Interaction**

- -Exchange
- -Cooperation
- -Competition
- -Conflict
- -Accommodation

## Exchange

• When people do something for each other with the express purpose of receiving a reward or return, they are involved in an exchange interaction.

• Individuals, groups and societies interact in an effort to receive a reward for their actions.

## Cooperation

- It occurs when two or more persons or groups work together to achieve a goal that will benefit many people.
- Can be used with other forms of interaction
- Gets thing done
- A cooperative interaction occurs when people act together to promote common interests or achieve shared goals

## Competition

- Competition is a form of conflict in which individuals or groups confine their conflict within agreed-upon rules.
- Two or more persons or groups oppose each other to achieve a goal that only one can attain.
- Follows accepted rules of conduct.
- Positive but can lead to conflict.

## Conflicts

- It's a deliberate attempt to control by force, oppose or harm the will of another person.
- Conflicts arise when people or groups have incompatible values or when the rewards or resources available to a society or its members are limited.
- One problem with conflict is that it: Often leads to unhappiness and violence which causes many people to view it negatively

## Accommodation

- State of balance between cooperation and conflict
- Give up a little and taking a little
- Four major types of conflicts exists



## **Types of Conflicts**

- Compromise: Two parties both give up something to come to an agreement
- Truce (Ceasefire/ negotiating period) : Brings a halt (stop) to conflict until a compromise is reached
- Mediation: A third party acts as a counselor in helping two parties reach an agreement
- Arbitration (mediation/negotiation): A third party makes a decision that is binding in all parties
