## PERSONAL PRONOUN

Personal pronouns replace the people or things. They can be singular or plural depending upon the situation. Personal pronouns may also take different forms depending on number, grammatical or natural gender, case and formality. Personal pronouns are I, He, Me, Us etc.

### Examples

- I went to visit her.
- I tell you hopeless grief is passionless!

## REFLEXIVE PRONOUN

When a subject perform an action on itself, the sentence uses a reflexive pronoun, after the verb. Reflexive Pronoun includes myself, himself, herself, etc.

### EXAMPLES

- They managed themselves very well as members of conference panel.
- I have told myself that a couple of times.

## RECIPROCAL PRONOUN

Reciprocal pronouns are similar to reflexive pronouns but they involved the groups of two or more that perform the same action. Reciprocal pronouns are each other (for the group of two) and one another (for larger group).

### Examples

- We give each other gifts during the holidays.
- They all support one another.

## POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

"A possessive pronoun is a pronoun that is used to indicate possession or ownership."

### EXAMPLES

- We shall finally have what is rightfully ours.
- Theirs mother gets along well with yours.

## RELATIVE PRONOUN

Relative pronoun starts with a clause which modifies or describes the noun. It is used to connect a clause or phrase to noun or pronoun. Relative pronouns are: who, which, that, whom, whose, where, when.

### EXAMPLES

\* Who  $\Rightarrow$  people

• This is a boy who is my brother.

\* Which  $\Rightarrow$  things

The park which is in New York is Central park.

\* That ⇒ People/Things

- This is a man that lived across the street.
- Look at the car that I bought yesterday.

\* Whom ⇒ People/Object/Preposition

- This is a boy whom I want to see.
- To whom this bag belongs?

\* Whose ⇒ Possession

- This is a boy whose book was stolen.

\* Where ⇒ Place

- This is the university where I study.
- This is the house where I live.

\* When ⇒ Indicate time

- I will always remember the day when we met.
