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Adverb

An adverb is a word that modifies a verb, an adjective, another adverb or even a whole sentence.

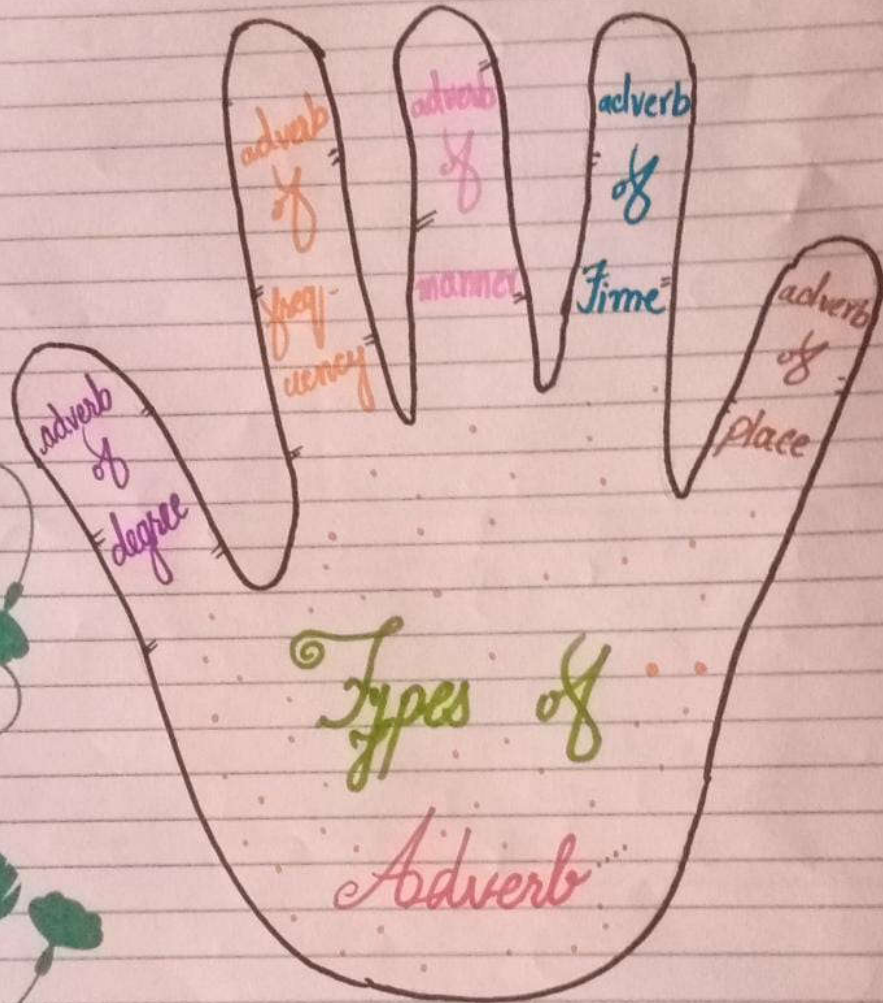
Examples:-

Early, First,
last, doing, Never, quickly
and sometimes etc.

Sentences:-

- She arrived early for the meeting.
- When I clean, I do laundry last.

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Adverb of Degree

adverbs of degree tell us about the intensity of something. adverb of degree are usually placed before the adjectives, adverb or verb that they modify although there are some exceptions.

Examples:

too, enough, very and extremely are examples of adverbs of degree.

Sentence:

• They are extremely happy today.
• I really hate travelling by road.

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Adverb of Frequency

The word which express frequency or how often something occurs is called adverb of frequency.

Examples:-

generally,
often, usually, normally
and sometimes

Sentences:

- We generally go to the sea for our holidays.
- They often go out for dinner.

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Adverbs of Manner

adverbs of manner

tells us how something happens. They are usually placed either after the main verb or after the object.

Examples:

quickly,
loudly, speedily
and beautifully etc.

Sentences:

- He ran quickly.
- She spoke softly.
- He plays beautifully.
