A verb is a word that describes an action being done by someone or something.

For example

The Horse is Running.



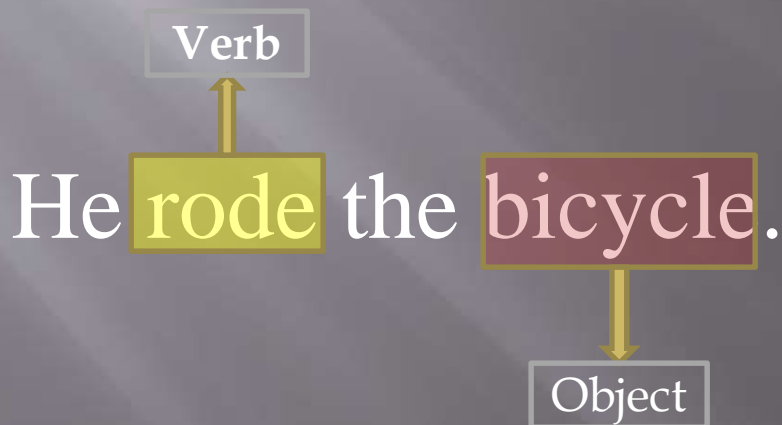
KINDS OF VERB

- Transitive Verb
- Intransitive verb

Transitive Verb

- Transitive verbs are action verbs that have an object to receive that action.

For Example:-



Intransitive Verb

- Intransitive verbs are action verbs but unlike transitive verbs, they do not have an object receiving the action.

For Example:-

- He **Laughed**
 - He **Jumped**

- ▣ Hide

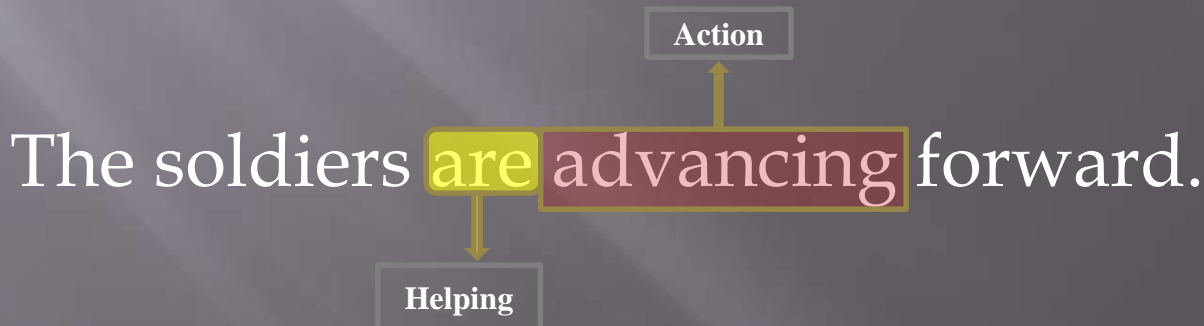
Helping Verb

Also called an auxiliary verb, which combines with a main verb to help it express the tense, mood, and voice.

They are added before the verb.

Common helping verbs

Be do have can may
will shall are is



Linking Verb

Connects or links a subject to a noun or an adjective in a predicate

For example:-

Subject

Noun

Messi **is** a football player.

- ▣ Verbs such as smell, look, taste, feel, remain, turn, appear, become, sound, seem, grow, stay can also be linking verbs.
