



Type 1

- If I don't eat breakfast, I always get hungry during class.
- Water <u>freezes</u> (will <u>freeze</u>) if the temperature goes below 32°F/0°C.
- If I don't eat breakfast tomorrow morning, I will get hungry during class.
- •of the weather is nice tomorrow, we will go on a picnic.

Type 2

 If I had the time, I would go to the beach with you this weekend.

(I don't have the time) (I am not going to the beach with you)

- He would tell you about it if he were here.
 (He doesn't tell you about it) (He is not here)
- If he <u>didn't speak</u> so quickly, you <u>could understand</u> him.

(He speaks so quickly) (you can't understand him)

Type 3

- If we had known that you were there, we would have written you a letter
- (We didn't know that you were there.) (We didn't write you a letter)
- If we hadn't lost our way, we would have arrived sooner.
- (We lost our way) (We didn't arrive early)
- Had we known that you were there, we would have written you a letter.
- Had she found the right buyer, she would have sold the house.

As If/As Tough

Subject + verb (present) + [as if/ as though] + subject + verb (past)...

 The old lady <u>dresses</u> <u>as if</u> it <u>were</u> winter even in the summer

(It is not winter)

 Angelique <u>walks</u> <u>as though</u> she <u>studied</u> modeling.

(She didn't study modeling.)

Subject + verb (past) [as if/as though] + subject + verb (past perfect)...

- Jeff looked as if he had seen a ghost.
 (He didn't see a ghost.)
- He looked as though he had run ten miles.
 (He didn't run ten miles.)
- Betty talked about the contest as if she had won the grand prize.
- (She didn't win the grand prize)

Hope/Wish

1. Future Wish

- We wish that you could come to party tonight. (You can't come)
- She wishes you would stop saying that. (you probably won't stop)
- Lwish she were coming with us. (She is not coming with us)

2. Present Wish

- We wish that he were old enough time to finish my homework. (He is not old enough) time.)
- They wish they didn't have to go to class today. (They have to go to class)

3. Past Wish

- I wish that I had washed the clothes yesterday. (I didn't wash the clothes.)
- -She wishes that she could have been there. (She couldn't be there)
