

Relief printing

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Relief printing is a family of printing methods where a printing block, plate or matrix that has had ink applied to its surface, but not to any recessed areas, is brought into contact with paper. The areas of the printing plate with ink will leave ink on the paper, whereas the recessed areas of the printing plate will leave the paper ink-free. A printing press may not be needed, as the back of the paper can be rubbed or pressed by hand with a simple tool such as a brayer or roller.

What is the relief method of printing?

Relief printing, in art printmaking, a **process** consisting of cutting or etching a **printing** surface in such a way that all that remains of the original surface is the design to be **printed**. Examples of **relief-printing** processes include woodcut, anastatic **printing** (also called **relief** etching), linocut, and metal cut.

What tools are traditionally used to do a relief print?

The relief family of techniques includes woodcut, metalcut, **wood engraving**, relief etching, linocut, rubber stamp, foam printing, potato printing, and some types of collagraph. Traditional text printing with movable type is also a relief technique.

What are the 4 types of printmaking?

1. Relief

What is the difference between intaglio and relief printing?

... **Intaglio prints** are a result of ink being retained by the gouges that are below the surface of the plate retaining the ink and transferring the ink to the paper.
