# Definition

# **Community pharmacy**

Community pharmacy means any place under the direct supervision of a pharmacist where the practice of pharmacy occurs or where prescription orders are compounded and dispensed other than a hospital pharmacy or a limited service pharmacy.

# Hospital pharmacy

Hospital pharmacy is the organization or department of the hospital to manage the procurement, storage, preservation, packaging, sterilization, compounding, preparation, dispensing or <u>distribution</u> of medicine in the hospital.
